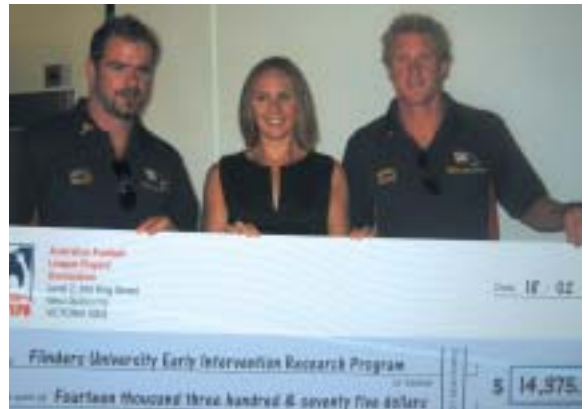

An Early Intervention Research Program is equipping parents with techniques they can use at home to help reduce the severity of autistic behaviour in children. It builds on a screening test developed by Flinders psychologist Robyn Young that can diagnose autism in children as young as two. To date 34 families have been helped through community funding, and more will soon be involved thanks to our AFL footballers - the program received the annual donation in SA from the AFL Players Charity Fund.

Flinders Bioremediation was established to commercialise our expertise in environmental biotechnology. The company specialises in bioremediation and organic waste technology and jointly runs a soil bioremediation plant at Adelaide's Southern Waste Depot. Past projects include composting 1200 tonnes of buried tuna carcasses. Current projects include biogas production from food waste and collaborations with the Patawalonga Catchment Water Management Board, Adelaide Hills Council, the EPA and Zero Waste SA.
